ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must have:

- Completed an accredited undergraduate program in the U.S. or its equivalent;

- Academic credentials at least equivalent to those required for the MPH program.

Applicants must submit:

- Application for Admission;
- Official Transcripts of all prior work;
- Scores from the Graduate Record Examination (GRE);
- Letter of Intent, including statement of purpose for application to the program;
- Two (2) Letters of Recommendation; and
- Application Fee.

International applicants must submit:

- TOEFL scores and WES evaluations.

The 15-Credit Clinical Epidemiology Certificate can help you advance your knowledge and skills to design, conduct and evaluate clinical research. Students will learn how best to incorporate valid research findings into clinical decision-making. Courses explore research methods/ study design, biostatistics, epidemiology and trial management.

PROGRAM DESIGN

You can complete the program in two-three semesters, if desired, or you can plan a schedule for completing the five courses over a two-year period (the maximum timeframe.) The evening schedule makes it convenient for you to continue working or gain experience while earning your Clinical Epidemiology Certificate. The Certificate courses may also be applied toward a MPH at the Rutgers School of Public Health. (Certificate holders must still apply and be admitted to the MPH program.)
