A. OSHA 10+ (Two day in-person training)

This course has a mandatory online introduction. After you register online, an email will be sent approximately two weeks prior to the start of the course with additional information about the online portion. The online portion is the NJDOE 2-hour Safety and Health overview for 2.0 PDUs. This should be completed the week before the in-person class and no later than the week after the in-person course. Certificates and blue cards will not be mailed until requirements of this course have been completed, and payment is received.

B. Designing & Implementing Student Training Plans (Three day in-person training)

This course includes two in-person meeting days with a site visit day in-between. The 1st and 3rd days are at the location you register for and the 2nd day is off-site to allow flexibility in conducting required field visit(s) and preparing for group discussion.
