ARTICULATED PROGRAM

ABOUT

The Rutgers School of Public Health's articulated Bachelor of Arts (BA) or Bachelor of Science (BS)/Master of Public Health (MPH) program is an excellent opportunity for students who are currently enrolled in a Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey or New Jersey Institute of Technology undergraduate program to get a head start on earning an MPH.

This program offers students the opportunity to earn an advanced degree across four academic departments and 13 concentrations.

Graduates are eligible to sit for the Certified in Public Health Exam.

PROGRAM FORMAT

The articulated program is not a concurrent program, meaning students earn their bachelor's degree first and then their master's degree.

Undergraduate students are conditionally accepted into the program while they complete their bachelor's degree. While still an undergraduate, paying undergraduate tuition, students may complete up to 18 graduate degree credits.

Upon the culmination of their bachelor's degree and maintaining a 3.0 GPA in the program's graduate courses, students then complete the remainder of their MPH curriculum requirements, as well as an applied practice experience, capstone research experience, and interprofessional experience.

Students enrolled in this program earn their MPH within three to five additional semesters beyond the completion of their bachelor's degree. Courses are available in-person, remote, and/or online.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants for admission must be enrolled in an undergraduate degree program - all academic majors are considered - at Rutgers University–New Brunswick, Rutgers University–Newark, Rutgers University–Camden, or New Jersey Institute of Technology, completed at least 60 undergraduate degree credits*, and received approval from their school contact. A recommended cumulative GPA of 3.2 at the time of application is also encouraged.

A complete application includes:

- Online application: visit go.rutgers.edu/sph-apply
- Official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions attended
- Statement of goals, one-to-three pages in length, which addresses:
 - Interest in the program
 - Preparedness for the program
 - Goals and aspirations
- Two letters of recommendation with at least one letter from an academic reference if you are currently enrolled in a degree program or have graduated within the last four years
- Resume or CV
- TOEFL or IELTS score for applicants educated in a non-native English-speaking country

Applications are accepted on a rolling, space-available basis following the regular deadline.
